SECTION 1: The Inner Reset — Days 1–10

Purpose: Transition from conquest to conscience.

Task	Guiding Thought	Dharmic Reference
  Pause before proclaiming.	Reflect before issuing decrees. Silence restores clarity.	Rama's meditative stillness before the coronation.
 Offer gratitude to allies and the Divine.	Victory is not ownership — it's stewardship.	Yajna before rulership.

SECTION 2: Listening First — Days 11–25

Purpose: Rebuild trust through empathy.

SECTION 3: Restoring Balance — Days 26–50

Purpose: Repair what was broken during conflict.

SECTION 4: Building Institutions — Days 51–75

Purpose: Move from personal charisma to stable governance.

Purpose: Transform power into sustainable service.
