★ SECTION 1: Emotional Theme Identification

(What the dream is actually carrying)

Instruction: Ignore symbols. Focus only on *felt experience*.

Primary Emotion Present (tick one or more):

- Fear / Threat
- Loss / Grief
- Shame / Exposure
- Confusion / Disorientation
- Anger / Frustration
- Helplessness
- Urgency
- Relief / Release (rare but important)

Intensity Level:

- Mild (lingers briefly)
- Moderate (affects mood for hours)
- High (affects body, sleep, focus)

★ SECTION 2: Stress Dream vs Trauma Dream

(This distinction prevents panic)

A. Stress-Processing Dream

- ✓ Common during economic, relational, or identity pressure
- ✓ Emotional but not overwhelming
- ✓ Symbolic, fragmented, non-linear
- ✓ Does **not** cause panic upon waking

Indicators (tick if true):

- Linked to current life stress
- Emotion feels familiar
- No bodily freeze response
- Dream fades during the day

➔ **Meaning:** The mind is *processing load*. No action required beyond awareness.

B. Trauma-Linked Dream

- ⚠ Less common, but important
- ⚠ Emotionally overwhelming
- ⚠ Body reacts strongly (sweating, panic, freeze)
- ⚠ Repeats with same emotional charge

Indicators (tick if true):

- Strong bodily reaction
- Same emotional spike every time
- Dream intrudes into waking fear
- Linked to unresolved past experience

➔ **Meaning:** The mind is **requesting support**, not interpretation.

Important:

Trauma dreams require **safety and containment**, not symbolic decoding.

★ SECTION 3: Resolution Signal Tracker

(Is the dream still “working” or has it completed its task?)

Dreams naturally **soften when integration begins**.

Track over 2–3 weeks only.

Signs the Dream Is Resolving:

- Emotional intensity reducing
- Symbols changing or dissolving
- Dream stops repeating
- Waking clarity increases
- One conscious decision has been made

Signs the Dream Is Still Active:

- Exact repetition
- Increased urgency
- Growing anxiety around sleep
- Avoidance of related waking issue

★ SECTION 4: Fear-Based Interpretation Trap Checklist

(If any of these appear — STOP interpretation)

- “This means something bad will happen”
- “This dream predicts death/loss”
- “I must decode every symbol”
- “Someone online knows what this means”
- “This dream has divine punishment energy”
- “If I ignore this, disaster follows”

➔ Reality Check:

Fear-based interpretations **increase anxiety, not insight.**

Dream clarity grows through grounding, not prophecy.

★ SECTION 5: One-Line Integration

(This replaces obsession)

Complete **only one** sentence:

“This dream is highlighting my unresolved _____, and my next grounded action is _____.”

No further analysis required.

★ SECTION 6: When NOT to Engage Further

Stop working with the dream if:

- It no longer repeats
- Emotion has softened
- Waking action has been taken
- Curiosity turns into anxiety

Silence after insight is success, not avoidance.
