Score Interpretation — Response to Loss

0–10 | Fractured Exile

II. Ethical Consistency Under Pressure (25 Points)

Self-Assessment Statements

6. I keep promises even when outcomes no longer benefit me
7. I do not justify shortcuts using urgency or victimhood
8. I treat dependents and subordinates with dignity during stress
9. I resist revenge disguised as justice
10. I accept delay without ethical erosion

Score Interpretation — Ethical Consistency

0–10 | Situational Dharma

Values change with pressure.

12. I take responsibility without recognition
13. I regulate anger before asserting control
14. I create stability in unstable environments
15. I prepare for roles I do not yet hold

Score Interpretation — Leadership in Absence

0–10 | Title-Dependent Leadership

Total Score Interpretation (Out of 75)
